

Town of Greentown Police Department Patrol Policy

A) Greentown Police Officers serve the citizens of Greentown and therefore need to focus their patrol in the Town of Greentown. However, there are occasions when a Greentown Police Officer needs to leave the Town of Greentown in the performance of their duties. Examples include, but not limited to:

1. Training
2. Court
3. Police supplies and equipment maintenance
4. Transport of prisoners to the appropriate correctional/detention facility
5. Criminal investigations to interview witnesses or victims, identify suspects, and recover evidence
6. Assisting other Law Enforcement Agencies
7. Directed patrols of Town-owned property that is located outside of the Town Limits
8. Assisting the Greentown Fire Company
9. Reference the Greentown Police Department Pursuit Policy.

B) Directed Patrols should include all businesses in the Town of Greentown. Every effort to patrol all streets in the Town at least once in a shift should be made. Directed Patrols for areas with numerous calls for service and special requests of private property checks made by citizens should be recorded. Business checks shall be recorded when making personal contact with business employees.

C) A Greentown Police Officer may volunteer assistance on calls outside the Town without specific request for assistance from another Law Enforcement Agency for areas that are commonly known as the Eastern Howard School District under the following conditions:

1. Priority 1 or 2 calls.
2. Citizens that reside outside the Town but make direct requests from a Greentown Police Officer for a police service.
3. Greentown Police Officers may conduct directed patrols of churches and businesses in Liberty Township and the communities of Jerome, Sycamore, and Plevna with the approval of the Marshall of the Town of Greentown. Directed patrols in each of these communities shall not be conducted more than once per shift.

D) Greentown Police Officers shall be strictly prohibited from conducting stationary traffic enforcement in an area outside of a one (1) mile radius of the Town limits.


E) All Greentown Police Officers shall use good sound judgment when responding to any form of police requests outside of the Town Limits within reasonable distance.

These guidelines shall be in full force and effect from and after October 18, 2016.




